My Boat Survey – Date	urvey – Date
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Hull (and Keel and Rudder)

- is it a watertight vessel, dry bilge? brown stains inside?
- any gouges, scrapes, scratches or blisters?
- any "rose buds" forming on my keel?
- anything growing on it (algae, mussels, slime ?)
- any thru-hull fittings (functional cutoffs do they work, plugs nearby, any leaks?)
- is my rudder tied down so it can't move while I'm away?
- does my rudder mount show any brown-stain signs of water invasion?
- when does my registration expire?

Deck

- any brown stains on fiberglass? (these are indications of core-rot, wood not rust)
- look for "trickle trails" and drip stains below decks
- chainplate and stanchion and other deck fittings showing any staining or wiggle?
 - Fred Schroth recommends re-bedding all thru-deck hardware annually
- winches lubed and making nice clicks when you spin them
- for deck stepped masts, is your cockpit convex? concave shows collapsed, water draw in

Standing Rigging

- any odd colored strand in wire rope (indicates a broken strand)?
- are spreader tips smooth for sail contacts, pinch-point guards in place?
- are all turnbuckles secured and ring-dings taped (replace any that are sprung)?

Running Rigging

- Halyards and Sheets are cover and core; and covers fail when you least expect
- Traveller cars rolling smooth
- Any oxidation of cam-cleats or their white plastic bearings?
- Mooring lines, anchor rode and dock rigging (any frays or nips in the lines?)

Sails and Canvas and Woodwork (weak spots against UV) (if sunshine see it, UV will eat it up)

- Woodwork requires 2-3x/year maintenance (whether varnished or oiled)
- Consider covering wood with canvas or replacing it with PlasTeak

Motor

- use only clean gas (use no-ethanol, aviation gas, or Stabile treatment)
- if you ever have to use ethanol gas, run it out of the engine always! (it will gum things up)
- check for water in your oil (white, foamy or greyish lube)
- change lower unit lubricant once a year on outboards
- a flooded carburetor float will cause fuel to flow freely overboard

Battery / Lights / Sensors / other electrics

- does your battery hold a charge or are there leak currents (measuring leak currents)
- battery terminals clean and covered
