

Entering your Boat Information in ClubSpot

Please help our Harbor Commander and Race Commander by updating your Boat information in Clubspot. The information includes Boat Class/Type, Sail Number, PRF rating (if relevant), Name, and more.

First Step: Go to <https://austinyachtclub.theclubspot.com/account/boats>, or

1. Login to your member account on the AYC website (austinyachtclub.net)
2. Select Clubspot on the far right of the blue menu bar across the top
3. Select My Account on the menu bar that comes up and log in
4. Click on the triple bar in the upper left corner of the page
5. One of the options you have in the drop down menu is Boats – select that.
6. You can add a new boat or select an existing boat to edit.

Next: Update Boat Details by clicking on the small pencil & pencil icon.

- Boat Name
- Sail Number
- Class / Type examples include Capri 25, Catalina 25 TM, J24, Ensign, J80, Hobie 16, Diam 24, Sunfish, Beneteau First 27, Pearson 26, Corsair 28R, etc. Be specific.
- Fleet examples are Catamaran, Diam 24, Ensign, J-PRF, J80, PRF-A, PRF-B, Pearson 26, or Trimaran.
- PHRF (or Portsmouth*) rating for that boat. Look in the [PRF Ratings Page](#) if you do not know your PHRF rating.
- Builder is the Manufacturer, such as J-Boat, Ensign, Pearson, Catalina, Corsair, etc.
- Model. Put in the full model name, such as Pearson 26, J-80, Catalina 22, Ensign, Sunfish, ILCA4, Hobie 16, F28R, Diam 24.

Finally, Scroll down and click update after making any changes.

Why update your Boat Information?

The Harbor Commander needs it when making slip assignments or changes. It's also important that they know who owns what boat where, in case owners need to be notified of situations regarding boats or docks.

Scoring needs accurate information. When you enter your boat in a Series or Regatta, it is important to have your boat class, type, sail number, name (if it exists), and the PHRF rating (if applicable.) There is a connection between your Clubspot boat information and your Clubspot race registration. If you have accurate information in Clubspot, you just have to enter it once and then it is part of your registration each time you sign up for a series or regatta at AYC.

Other members like to know. If they look up your name in the AYC Clubspot Member Directory and click on your name, they will see your Boats.
